For such a small country, Scotland has a significant cultural footprint beyond its legendary **kilts** and **bagpipes**. Sitting on the Northernmost point of the United Kingdom, Scotland has a robust and independent history of Roman soldiers, Vikings, noble clansmen, and powerful monarchs. Today, the country must reconcile its unique civil law history with the more centralized UK common law, implications of Brexit, and renewed efforts towards Scottish Independence.

Our private delegation will explore different aspects of Scottish culture. Excursions will include tours of the Edinburgh Castle, traditional music, dance, whisky and haggis; as well visits to Scotland's second city – **Glasgow** - and the picturesque **St. Andrews**, the birthplace of golf. We will also gain a working knowledge of the Scottish legal and political system through guided visits to **high Courts** and the **Scottish Parliament**.

The amusing capital of **Edinburgh** will be our home base for this unique opportunity to enjoy the best of Scotland while earning CLE credits! Friends and family are welcome.

Sunday, June 11

Group participants arrive throughout the day. Our hotel is located in New Town and near the Royal Mile making it easy to discover Edinburgh's outstanding history and architectural beauty.

Early arrivals may begin exploring the city in advance of our programmed activities. You'll find Edinburgh to be a hilly but extremely pedestrian friendly city with great shops and pubs.

Afternoon

Meet in the hotel lobby to depart for a guided 'pre-orientation' walking tour of **New Town** featuring **Calton Hill** overlook for the best panoramic view of the city of Edinburgh.

Monday, June 12

Morning

Walking tour of **Old Town Edinburgh** and the Royal Mile, and a visit to the Faculty of Advocates.

Devils & Advocates: Introduction to the Scottish Legal System

Located on the Royal Mile are some of Scotland's most important legal institutions: The Supreme Civil Court of Scotland, the Court of Session, The old Parliament House, and the Faculty of Advocates.

We take a break from our walking tour to learn about the Scottish legal system, how the system operates under UK law, and a brief history of the various types of courts and judges. Court calendars permitting, we visit the **Court of Session** and **High Court of Justiciary**.

12:30 PM

Lunch along the Royal Mile.

2:00 PM

Lawmaking, the Scottish Parliament, and the Legislative Process.

After lunch, we enjoy a tour of the **Scottish Parliament**. In addition to learning about the history and architecture of this unique building, we learn about Scotland's political system, the balance between state autonomy with the United Kingdom and Westminster, and Scotland's views on **Brexit**. As part of our visit, we have the chance to visit the Debating Chamber or a Committee Meeting to see how lawmaking happens first hand, how the legislative bodies pass laws, and how the courts may interpret them.

3:30 PM

After our visit to the Scottish Parliament, we enjoy Edinburgh's finest **Afternoon Tea** at the **Signet Library**.

Legacy Tartans, Commodification of Culture, and the Scottish Registry

During Afternoon Tea, we are joined by experts for a discussion on Tartan designs and their intellectual property rights.

Following our Afternoon tea, you may return to the hotel with the group walking downhill back to New Town, or enjoy additional free time in Old Town Edinburgh.

The remainder of the evening is free.



Tuesday, June 13

9:00 AM

This morning, we depart for Scotland's second city and cultural hub – **Glasgow** (approx. 1 hour).

Women, Leadership & the Law in Scotland

On arrival in Glasgow, we meet with **Joanne Gillies**, International chair of her firm's **Female Futures**. *This meeting will take place at the Pinsent Masons law office in Glasgow.* From Pinsent Masons, we continue onward for our Glasgow Food & City tour.

GLASGOW FOOD & CITY TOUR

As part of our immersion into Glasgow, we dive into the local food, drink and modern innovations of Scotland's "Second City" with **Brenda Anderson**, the World Food Travel Association's Ambassador for Scotland. A wide range of local **food and drink tastings** are included in the tour which will delight the foodies in all of us. As part of the tour, we will also see some of Glasgow's **street art** and large **murals** coloring what is otherwise a gray and industrial cityscape.

Before leaving town, we visit the impressive **Glasgow Cathedral**.

3:30 PM

Return to Edinburgh (approx. 50 minutes).

Remainder of the evening free. Dinner on your own.



Wednesday, June 14

On the last full day of the core program enjoy as much free time as desired.

Morning

Meet in the hotel lobby and depart for our tour of **Edinburgh Castle**.

Lunch is on your own.

7:30 PM

For our private dinner, we will be joined by **Claire Madison Mitchell QC** and **Zoe Venditozzi**, founders of the **Witches of Scotland** campaign.

WITCHES OF SCOTLAND: Lessons from the 1563 Witchcraft Act

In 1563 the Witchcraft Act was brought into law in Scotland and remained in law till 1736. The vast majority of those accused and prosecuted were women.

During this time witchcraft was a capital crime and those convicted of witchcraft were strangled to death and then burned at the stake so as to leave no body to bury. The Witches of Scotland is a campaign for justice: for legal pardons, an official apology, and a national monument for the thousands of people – mostly women - that were convicted of witchcraft and executed between 1563 and 1736 in Scotland.

In a statement made on International Women's Day 2022, part of the campaign's mission was achieved when Prime Minister **Nicola Sturgeon** issued an official apology on behalf of the Scottish government.

Day 5

Thursday, June 15

Morning

Depart for the bucolic **St. Andrews** (Approx. 1 hour drive), a historic medieval town known for its many golf courses including the **Old Course**, considered the world's oldest. In St. Andrews we see the ruins of St Andrews Cathedral and the immaculate **University of St Andrews** founded in 1413.

Free time will be given in town for independent lunch and shopping.

While in St. Andrews, some may wish to visit the World Golf Museum or walk across the 18th hole of the Old Course for a photo opportunity at the iconic Swilcan Bridge - originally built over 700 years ago so shepherds could move their flock across the bridge which meanders through what is now the 1st and 18th fairways. Time permitting, return to Edinburgh via the Fife Coastal Path. Along this stretch of picturesque coastline we see a series of charming, old-fashioned fishing villages

villages.

Day 6 Friday, June 16

Morning

Today we depart for a day tour of an underappreciated area known as "the Scottish Borders," the towns of Selkirk and Melrose, in southern Scotland near its land border with England.

First we see **Melrose Abbey**, the medieval ruins of a Cistercian monastery and burial place of Robert the Bruce's heart, <u>OR</u> **Abbotsford**, the home of Sir Walter Scott and baronial mansion. A breathtaking place to visit located on the banks of the River Tweed.

11:00 AM

We continue to **Locharron of Scotland** for a Mill Tour to learn about Scottish kilt and tartan making from this renowned producer.

1:00 PM

Group Lunch and traditional Ale Pies at the **Traquair House**, the oldest continually inhabited house in Scotland and home to the ancient **Traquair Brewery**. At lunch we hope to be greeted by the esteemed Human Rights attorney, **Mark Muller Stuart**.

After lunch, we tour the Traquair House and enjoy an Ale Tasting with **Catherine Maxwell Stuart**, 21st Lady of Traquair and famed Scottish politician, hotelier, brewer, and writer. She is the first female Laird of Traquair and, at the time she succeeded her father in 1990, she was the only female laird in Scotland.

After our tour we return to Edinburgh.




Saturday, June 17
